A LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Research consistently shows that moving to a new home is one of life's most stressful events. The anxiety and pressure of finding a new home. coordinating logistics, packing, and physically moving items can cause a major disruption in our routine.

In August, Anawim Housing moved to 1535 Linden Street and felt that disruption firsthand. As we settle into our new space and unpack final boxes, we remember the people we serve and the stress they face when it comes to moving. For many of our tenants, behind the joy of move-in day is the trauma of being displaced and the stress of not knowing where their family might sleep the next night. At Anawim, we help reduce this stress by connecting tenants with a support system of program managers and advocates who work with each household to gain housing stability.

While the stress of moving offices has slowed. Anawim has also embarked on an organizational change. This August, we moved all of our property management operations under the name of our third-party management entity: Allterra Property Solutions. This change is immediately evident when you visit our new space. Come in the front door at 1535 Linden Street and you'll see a



bright vellow Anawim Housing door to your right and a green Allterra Property Solutions door to your left. This change has allowed us to provide a specific focus on our mission oriented work of providing permanent supportive housing solutions for our community's most vulnerable individuals and families.

Ensuring the stability of these households is one of the most vital roles we provide and we believe we must continue to strengthen our efforts on behalf of all those we serve. This focus further achieves our goal of better communicating Anawim's overall purpose to the community, our supporters and all those that have come to know the work of Anawim Housing.


Anawim tenants help plan community event to share stories of overcoming homelessness

The Summer Solstice is the first day of summer and the longest day of the year. It's a day filled with light. A day when communities across the nation join together to celebrate the stories of those who have overcome homelessness. This June. Anawim Housing and the Polk County Continuum of Care hosted Des Moines' first summer solstice celebration - Rising Toward Community - to honor the strength, resilience, and spirit of the people we serve.

When Cynthia Latcham, Director of Programs & Services, talks about the people we serve, she uses person-centered language. This approach focuses on the who, not the what. Homelessness is not permanent, but the stigma often stays with people after they regain housing. At Anawim, we focus on the person and their unique history and experience.

"The people we serve are tenants, vulnerable populations, people who have lived experience," says Cynthia. "Those who are currently homeless are people experiencing homelessness. Labels can be expedient, but also dehumanizing. Just as your experiences are valuable, so are those who have lived experience."

Rising Toward Community put that person-centered commitment into action by giving people with lived experience the voice and power to make the celebration their own. Full Circle participants from Anawim's peer support group met throughout the spring to plan the event. They showed up early on June 21st to set up chairs, pass out programs, and welcome guests. Three Full Circle participants. Bonnie, Tonya, and Courtney, took the stage to tell their story of overcoming homelessness and call us to action. Mayor Frank Cownie and State Senator Claire Celsi shared remarks about political policies and practices needed to end homelessness. We look forward to Rising Toward Community becoming an annual, community-wide celebration each June.





If you are around Anawim Housing long enough, you're bound to read or hear our tagline home is everything. It is on t-shirts, thank you notes, our videos, and social media accounts. It is a line that gets to the heart of our work and the language is intentional. We do not say "housing is everything", and participants in our permanent supportive housing programs know that distinction better than anyone.

"In the beginning, Anawim was just shelter, a place to sleep, a room with a door," says Randy who has been with Anawim Housing for 10 years, "but it became something so much more because Anawim gave me the space, the resources, and the time I needed to create a home."

Randy was experiencing homelessness and still remembers the day Anawim Housing staff found him in a soup kitchen line. During that period he saw his peers gain and lose housing. He witnessed the cycle of homelessness. Even at that point, he understood the difference between a house and a home. He recognized that stable housing was about far more than a new lease and a set of keys.

Part of creating a home for Randy has been developing strong friendships and relationships. "You need people that know you, people you can trust, people who think of you as an equal," says Randy. "Anawim Housing met me without judgment, pressure, or agenda."

Cindy McGrane, Anawim's Senior Program Manager, began working with Randy in July of 2017. "Randy does the footwork and trusts the process," says Cindy. "He has a simple but steady attitude of gratitude."

When asked about the challenges he's faced and overcome, Randy laughs, "you'd think the biggest one would be the booze, but that wasn't it. It has been trying to find rhythm in the insanity."

It's a challenge that we all face - balancing work, creating positive routines, developing good habits, handling the chaos and hardships that will inevitably come our way. "I'm able to see things clearly. It's good thing rather than going through life blind or bleary-eyed," says Randy, reflecting on sobriety.

Shortly after Cindy and Randy met, Randy decided to quit drinking. "This was a huge accomplishment! He worked with Scott Sithonnorath, Anawim's Employment Specialist, who assisted him in getting a job at the Altoona Outlet Mall. These two accomplishments paved the way for Randy to clear his head and feel good about himself again," says Cindv.

Stable housing has helped Randy find balance amidst the insanity. He has a job he likes with a boss who supports him. He has time and energy to learn new things. "Expansion is a really good thing. It's a quirk of mine, but every year I commit to learning something new."

Having a safe place to call home gives Randy - and all of the households Anawim serves - the time and security they need to define and start working toward their goals.

"It's simple," says Randy, "Anawim Housing saved my life."

Whiz Kidz Throughout the summer, on the last Thursday night of the month, we were thrilled to have the WhizKidz program at The Crest, brought to us by our community partners at the East Side Community Center, Freedom for Youth, and several participating churches. WhizKidz is a mentoring and tutoring program that meets weekly throughout the school year. To help our families get an idea of what the program was all about, WhizKidz volunteers brought games, craft activities, wonderful meals, and Bible lessons out to the property. They spent time getting to know our families while everyone enjoyed food, fun, and community.

Since it's inception, it has become a place for tenants in Anawim's permanent supportive housing programs to meet every Friday to connect, grow, learn, and buld community. Participants have come together as a family and have participated in helping plan and host Anawim Housing's "Rising Toward Community Event" last June. The group also gathers outside of regular meeting times for additional activities that create community.

bedroom apartments. Units are a mixture of affordable and market rate.
